"After a while, the brook dried up"

It is good to be called by the name of Jesus. Failures will come but in the name of Jesus, we are more than victorious.

The word of God is anointed and blessed. I have read this scripture time and time again and I would like to share this thought with you - after a while, the brook dried up. Everything belongs to God and so we must be careful what we give to God. We have to use the things he gives us wisely. It is a possibility that what he gives to us can shift out of our hands. You can be tried in this way - the same God who blesses you can shift things out of your hand and he can try us to see if we trust him.

The man of God came with a word to Ahab who turned away from the true God. Elijah came with a word from God that there will be no rain for 3.5 years. I don't know how long he was at the brook eating from the ravens as God provided.

A brook is sustained by rain.

Don't be satisfied sitting at Cherith and putting your things together that there is where God wants you to be, there is a greater blessing at Zarephath. You will understand those who passed were at Cherith and now God is moving us to Zarephath.

Cherith is only sustenance for a while, while Zarephath is a level of continuous anointing. Don't sit and look at your job and your car and your house because you can be tested and everything will be dried up.

Don't hug up the little that you have but give what you have. We don't know the magnitude of the power of God. We serve a God who is more intelligent than our brains can understand. He is faithful to his promise and if you listen you can not lose a battle.

I Look at the sickness now and I said the brooks were drying up but then God sends a missionary to pray for you and they announce blessing and healing and deliverance. We don't try to use God because we want natural things there is a spiritual path God was pointing to. Don't be comfortable there is greater work to be done.

At Zarepath there is a crying that the Lord will hear.

I'm not saying that God won't bless us as we were at Cherith but be careful when blessing comes into your hand. Don't take the blessing of God to flirt it around to make others ashamed because all that you have and will ever achieve belongs to God and you can not show off with what God has blessed you with. Just share - don't sit with a Cherith attitude and think that all is well.

That miracle would show up in our lives if you move from Cherith. Check out the move of God, healing only he can sustain. A deliverance that comes to the table to God. A seeking that only God can fulfill. Drop at Zarephath with your faith and hope and God will sustain you. There is no life outside of Christ.

Do the shifting now where God is able to unfold in you his mystery and God can download in your spirit what he wants you to know there is a word in your mouth that can bring others to life.

Set yourself up so that Life can breathe in you, don't sit at Cherith. The brook will dry up.

All of you who are sick shift out of your comfort zone and get to Zarepath and let God give you the ability to climb and soar in God.

I will not stay at Cherith any longer. Sometimes you have to shift your family life and go to Zarepath where there is sustenance coming from God and God alone. There is another move. Somethings you must shift it up. Don't just give because you feel like it gives as God instructs. Make God direct you. Shift Cherith. Cherith is where the temporal rest but Zarephath is where God sustains you.

Whatever you achieve in this life is dry but let us find Zarepath where God blesses us with life.
